• Please describe your experience of taking the CAM exam online.

Being able to take the exam when I was ready and in my environment (office) was a benefit for me. I took half of the exam one week and the other half the next week. Once I started taking the exam, it wasn't as intimidating as I had made it out to be. I could take as few or many sections of the test as I wanted to. This made it less stressful than sitting in a room for 3 hours taking a written exam.

• Did you receive any response from employers, alarm industry, members of the community about your achievement?

My division gave me a card and Ghirardelli dark chocolate with sea salt squares to celebrate my success. I receive certification pay for being a certified alarm manager.

• Do you think accomplishing your certification has benefited your career or position as an alarm manager/coordinator? Has it made a difference in what you do?

Absolutely! It gave me the self-confidence that I know more about alarms than I gave myself credit for. I have the knowledge to help alarm users with their false alarm issues.

• Do you think others could benefit from achieving their Certification status?

Definitely. It demonstrates your commitment to false alarm reduction and you are a subject matter expert in false alarm management.
