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Economic Downturn Challenges FARA and FARA Adapts

The downturn in the US economy has resulted in many challenges for us all including restrictions on travel and the ability to make long distance calls, as well as on the time each of us is able to devote to tasks that are over and above our responsibilities at home and work. Many jurisdictions are leaving positions unfilled or are abolishing them altogether. Others are instituting mandatory unpaid days off. Some have even been forced to lay employees off. Given these dire times, it is even more important for FARA to stand strong and help our members succeed, which has a positive effect on the public safety agency, as well as on city and/or county resources.

These economic challenges have had several direct impacts on FARA.

2009 Denver Symposium Cancelled

It is with profound regret that the Board was forced to cancel our 2009 Annual International Training Symposium in Denver due to the horrendous economy and the inability of most of our public safety members to travel. As of our board meeting on January 21, two paid attendees had registered for the Denver Symposium. In preparation for the Board meeting, board members informally polled members to see if they were likely to be able to travel to Denver this year. Our conversations with members around the US and Canada confirmed that the travel restrictions are unlikely to be removed before the end of this year. Many indicated that travel would not be approved even if we could find a way to raise funds to pay for their travel.

Deadlines in our agreement with the host hotel escalated the cancellation penalties if we waited beyond January 25, 2009 to make a decision.

After exploring all the options we could think of, the board was forced to cancel the symposium. We all deeply regret any inconvenience this may cause any of our members. We are working as a board and with our committees to find alternative methods to get the information normally shared at a symposium out to our members.

The uncertainty of our economy has led many localities to restrict funding for travel resulting in our having to cancel our annual symposium. The symposiums have been the cornerstone to training our members in false alarm reduction. As you know, training is vital to any successful program and to meeting our member's needs.
