## **Mid-Atlantic Chapter of FARA**

In 2008 the FARA International membership approved a Bylaw amendment (at the FARA Symposium in Charleston, South Carolina) which provided for the creation of regional Chapters. The Maryland Chapter was formed in May 8, 2008 under the name of FARA Maryland Chapter. On March 4, 2010 the Chapter members voted to include Virginia, West Virginia, Pennsylvania, Delaware and the District of Columbia in the Chapter and to change the name to the Mid-Atlantic Chapter of FARA.

The scope of the membership was changed in an effort to include public safety and industry representatives who did not have a state Chapter and had been participating and contributing as guests (non-voting members) in the Maryland Chapter meetings. Full-membership allows voting privileges in the Chapter. Current membership has representation from Maryland and Virginia. We welcome other state and District of Columbia participation.



The Chapter meets four times a year (twice via conference call). During the last year, meetings have rotated to the sites of various jurisdictions. This has been a good opportunity to see the facilities of counterparts. The benefit of the Chapter is that jurisdictions can work together on issues which cross jurisdictions, share expertise and solve common problems facing false alarm reduction administrators and industry leaders. One of the ongoing efforts of the Chapter has been to share information regarding summer sales (door-to-door alarm systems) and how to alert consumers to potential unscrupulous companies. The Chapter also has a yearly meeting with the Maryland Burglar and Fire Alarm Association (MDBFAA). This provides an excellent opportunity to meet and network with industry leaders and for them to meet and network with public safety leaders. Currently the Chapter is working with MDBFAA to include public safety staff in a two-day Level One Burglar Alarm and Limited Fire Technician class.

Several members of the Chapter participated in FARA's "Train the Trainer" class, and we are happy to announce that William Douglas, Alarm Coordinator for the Loudoun County Sheriff's Office in Virginia and Stuart Forchheimer of Home Safe Security in Baltimore, Maryland are the newest instructors for FARA's Essentials of False Alarm Reduction course. We are looking to hold the Essentials course later this year.






# Featured Manual - Acronyms and Terms Glossary

# **Revision of False Alarm Reduction Standard Now Available From SIA**

The Security Industry Association (SIA) has released a revised control panel standard that is intended to reduce the number of false alarms. The ANSI/SIA CP-01-2010 Control Panel Standard – Features for False Alarm Reduction – a revision of ANSI/SIA CP-01-2007 – details the design features for security system control panels and their associated arming and disarming devices that are recommended to reduce the incidence of false alarms.

The FARA Model ordinance requires that "Alarm Installation Companies shall use only ANSI/SIA CP-01 listed alarm control panels on all new installations and panel replacements or upgrades."

#### Notable updates include:

- new specifications for carbon monoxide zones
- revised qualifications for swinger shutdown
  - o programmable for one to as many as six trip(s) before shutdown
  - allows reset automatically after eight (8) or more hours with no further trips on the zone.
  - The default setting for this option changed from 1 to two trips.
- elimination of single button 'press and hold' panic buttons on arming stations
- shortened and clarified the definition of Duress
- shortened and revised the definition of Panic
- indicates when Unvacated Premises option is required
- allows an exception to entry exit requirements for commercial, high security installations that meet UL 2050, "National Industrial Security" requirements
- requires audible warning on automatic termination of a test

changes prohibition on 1+duress to prohibit "automatic derivative of another user code"
